ASBK RACE SECRETARYS' OFFICE

The ASBK Race Secretary's Office will be in the main paddock adjacent to pit lane and will be open at the following times: **Note: ASBK Race Direction, Timekeeping and Steward contact is via this office.**

ACCREDITATION

Hard cards have been issued to those who have applied. For the 2024 ASBK Season, all teams who opt in for the Series Hard Cards will also receive Series Car Passes. Please refer to Competitor Information Kit for allocation.

For those of you who do not have hard cards, electronic tickets will be sent to the rider's email address as listed in their Ridernet profile account. Please ensure this is up to date and check your "spam" mail a few days before the event. Any issues email events2@ma.org.au.

CREDENTIALS OFFICE

All hard cards have now been issued for the season. For those of you who do not have hard cards, **electronic tickets will be sent to the rider's email address** as listed in their Ridernet profile account. Please ensure this is up to date and check your "spam" mail a few days before the event. Any issues please email ticketebo.com.au.

CIRCUIT ENTRY / BUMP IN AND CLOSING TIMES:

Circuit Entry will be via Main entrance, off Old Stanthorpe Road. Circuit is located at Killarney Vista, Warwick (southwest of Brisbane).

Access for Competitors commences on Thursday from 11.00am and no later than 6.00pm for all classes. Entry to the Paddock is via the Main Entrance.

On initial entry to the main paddock competitors an only set-up in the space allocated by ASBK personnel and must use only this space for the remainder of the event. Please refer to the Paddock Map and Carport allocation list for Round 4.

TEMPORARY STRUCTURES

It is the responsibility of the competitor to provide a structure which meets all Occupational Health and Safety, and Australian Engineering Standards. The temporary structure must be pegged and weighed down in a designated area. MA or ASBK Management take no responsibility for structures causing damage due to being secured insufficiently.

TRACK INSPECTION

Competitors are invited to inspect the track by walking only (no push bikes, scooters (incl. electric or skateboards), on Thursday afternoon between 2.00pm and 5.00pm or Friday morning 6.30am – 7.00am.

In addition to the no push bikes/ scooters or skateboards allowed for the Track Inspection, there are to be no Scooters pushbikes or skateboards within the Pit paddock confines during the event.

VEHICLE PASSES AND PARKING

For those who do don't have series car passes, these are to be collected from the ASBK Race Secretary's Office from 1.30pm Thursday during the commencement of Sign-On. If not collected at this time they will be available from the Credentials Office located prior to Circuit/Paddock Entry Gate from Friday morning.

Transporter Passes have been allocated and must be displayed to gain access to the Paddock area.

Non-working vehicles, including rental and personal cars will not be eligible to park in the paddock, even with the Transport Car Pass. These vehicles must be parked in P2.

P2 parking is in the P2 Parking area prior to entry to the paddock area entry.

All vehicle passes are required from Friday and must be displayed in the front Windscreen on each vehicle. If the pass is not displayed in the windscreen, you will be denied entry.

Any reports of poor behaviour reported to Security, venue staff or officials are subject to sporting penalties under the ASBK Sporting Regulations.

Please note all fire lanes and service road accesses must be kept clear at all times.

CARPORT ALLOCATIONS

Please note due to restrains with the paddock layout at Morgan Park Raceway, parking will be restricted. Competitors and support personnel are requested to please respect the parking requirements in place.

Power to the Pit Garage carports behind the Tower:

- Competitors must only use the power points with the BLACK faces in the carports for tyre warmers etc. This is most important and will be policed over the three days.
- The normal white power points cannot be used. If they are, it will cause tripping of the power. This will result in loss of power to Timing and Race Control

Competitors in carports 61 – 84 may park one working vehicle or one trailer in the grassed area across from their carports. A vehicle and a trailer will not be permitted. A Transporter sticker must be affixed to the vehicle or trailer being used as the working vehicle.

Competitors in carports 36 – 60 may park their trailers only in the area designated on the Carport Allocation and a Transporter sticker must be affixed to the trailer.

Competitors in carports 16 – 27 (OJC) will be issued with a P2 Parking Pass only and must park at the back of the paddock in the P2 Parking area as indicated on the ASBK Round 4 Parking Map and Paddock Layout.

All remaining vehicles will be required to park in the P2 Parking area at the very back of the paddock along the fence line as indicated on the ASBK Round 4 Parking Map and Paddock Layout.

All competitors are required to affix their name, class, and rider number to the front of the carport. Sporting Regs 1.28.5

COMPULSORY SIGN IN

ALL COMPETITORS, CREW MEMBERS, ENTRANTS AND PARENT/GUARDIANS must sign in at the ASBK Race Secretary's Office prior to attending Technical Inspection and any on track activity. If a rider, team manager or entrant does not sign-on prior to the rider going out on track, a penalty will apply.

Rider Sign in will be via an electronic system. Riders MUST bring their MA licence card or MA App to Sign-in. Crew members sign in will be done manually.

BRIEFINGS FOR RIDERS, TEAM MANAGER, ENTRANTS, PARENT/GUARDIANS

Compulsory rider, Team Manager, Entrants, Parent/Guardian briefings will be held on Friday morning in Morgan Park Maintenance Shed near the canteen at the following times:

Friday Briefing SSP300 / R3 Cup / OJC	0730-0750
Friday Briefing SBK / SSP	0800-0815

Failure to attend the Briefings, sign the attendance register, or arrive late without an acceptable reason will result in a fine and possible exclusion from the meeting.

If you are not attending Friday practice, please email the Race Secretary beforehand to organise an alternate briefing on Saturday morning.

This applies also to All Team Managers, Entrants, Parents and or Guardians.

The nominated Entrant for any rider MUST sign-on to activate their representation of their rider. Failure to sign-on and attend the briefing may result in exclusion from any representation of the rider.

OFFICIAL TYRE ALLOCATION:

Pirelli, Dunlop, Bridgestone and Michelin will provide tyre service.

Tyres for Superbike, Supersport-and Supersport 300 are available to competitors and must be selected from the 2024 ASBK Tyre Homologation List.

TECHNICAL INSPECTION

A limited Technical Inspection will commence on Thursday afternoon from approximately 4pm to 6.00pm

Technical Inspection will continue Friday morning at the following times:

Note: Oceania Junior Cup competitors must take their safety apparel to the technical inspection shed

ALL competitors must take their safety apparel to the technical Inspection shed at times listed above.

Rear stand MUST be provided by the team for each machine to complete ASBK Technical Inspection.

Competitors are to submit their machines in accordance with Sporting Regulations V7.

Damaged Helmet Procedure – In the event of a crash, all competitors Helmets that are involved in an incident will be inspected by ASBK Technical. If a helmet is determined to be not suitable for further use, the helmet will be impounded and not returned to the competitor till the end of the meeting.

NOISE RESTRICTIONS – STARTING OF ENGINES

No Engines are to be run before 8.00am and after 7:00pm on any day of the event.

RACE NUMBERS

Unless you have been notified by the Race Secretary or MA Office, your allocated race number is as per your entry registration and/or the latest version of the Allocated Numbers document. Race Number decals are available for purchase from the ASBK Race Secretary's Office at \$5 per number.

WRIST BANDS: SUPERSPORT 300 / R3 CUP / OJC CLASSES

All Crew members requiring access to pit lane, or the signalling area must present to the Race Secretary Office and sign-on.

A maximum of 3 wristbands per rider will be issued (excluding the rider) to crew members.

Note: No wristbands will be issued without presenting to the Race Secretary office and signing an indemnity.

Access for each class crew member is only during relevant practice sessions, qualifying sessions, and races.

All crew members must wear their MA issued identification bands on the wrist for all 3 days.

WRIST BANDS & CREW MEMBER LICENCES: SUPERBIKES AND SUPERSPORT

All Crew members requiring access to pit lane, or the signalling area including access the Media Grid (Pit Wall/Signal area) must present to the Race Secretary Office and sign-on.

Crew members wishing to gain access to the grid must hold either a valid crew or senior national licence and wear their ASBK issued identification bands on the wrist for all 3 days.

A maximum of 5 wristbands per rider will be issued (excluding the rider but including the Promotional staff) to crew members for Superbike and Supersport.

Access for each class crew member is only during relevant practice sessions, qualifying sessions, and races.

Any unlicenced Crew Members who require access to the media grid must report to the Race Secretary's prior to any grid activity to obtain a one event crew licence.

CREW MEMBER LICENCE PRE-EVENT APPLICATION

It is highly recommended that Crew licences are applied for prior to the weekend. One event and annual crew licences can be applied for via Ridernet. Crew member sign-in will be done manually at the Race Secretary's Office.

PIT LANE / WORKING IN PIT LANE AND ACCESS TO PIT LANE WALL.

Refer to Sporting Regulations 3.5

- No personnel will be allowed on pit wall at the start of a race. Once the field has passed the start line, only Team members in control of pit boards will be allowed on the pit wall.
- Strictly Only three (3) personnel per team will be allowed on pit wall.
- Teams must leave the signalling area when other classes are on track.
- NOTE: Only those on Pit wall in the Signalling area and pit lane with either an MA issued Crew or senior National Licence, along with the correct wristband will be covered under MA's personal accident insurance coverage.
- Speed limit in pit lane is maximum 40km/h. The restricted Speed Zone does not finish until the sign and white line at the end of pit exit.
- Speed in the pit complex is 10 km/h with a helmet to be worn at all times.

ACCESS TO AND EXIT FROM TRACK

Further directions will be issued at Rider's briefing Friday morning.

During practice/qualifying sessions and races competitors and teams may use the pit lane for pit stops and only immediately prior to and during these sessions, with the appropriate pit-crews for each of their sessions. All equipment must be promptly removed when the session ends.

Service vehicles are not permitted in pit lane.

For all qualifying and racing sessions, competitors must return to their pits via the Technical Inspection Bay unless otherwise directed.

WARM UP LAPS

All Competitors will be given one (1) sighting and one (1) warm-up lap for each race, with the exception of Blu Cru OJC competitors who will be given one warmup lap only.

PARC FERME AND PODIUM PRESENTATIONS

Top 3 riders only must enter the podium area. Parc Ferme is located adjacent to the Technical Inspection area.

Podium Presentations will be located opposite the superbike paddock marquees.

MEDICAL SERVICES

The Medical Centre will be located in the paddock near pit entry. RACESAFE will be in attendance and will provide a Medical Service including Doctors, Medics, and a Sports Medicine Service. A Queensland Ambulance Service crew will also be in attendance.

New Competitors must complete the RACESAFE Medical History Form and submit to Race Secretary via email preferably prior to the event, send to racesec1@ma.org.au or present completed form to the Race Secretary's office no later than Friday morning. (form available from www.asbk.com.au). Information provided on this form will be kept strictly confidential.

A concussion policy will be in place and applied at all rounds. Refer to MA Website for more information or details on the MA Concussion Guidelines.

TIMING

Transponders will be available for collection from the Race Secretary's Office on Friday morning at 7.15am. No deposit is required.

Payment for transponder mounting brackets (\$15) and transponders for second bikes not paid for on entry (\$25) must be made by EFTPOS or credit card. No cash will be accepted. Further details are provided in the ASBK Rd.4 Timing Bulletin.

It is the competitor's responsibility to return transponders to the pit office at the conclusion of their events. Where transponders are not returned, additional charges may become payable until the transponder is returned to Computime as directed by MA staff.

CIRCUIT CATERING

The onsite catering will operate from Thursday (10am – 2pm) & Friday to Sunday inclusive from 7am.

CIRCUIT CAMPING

Overnight Camping at the circuit is not allowed.

BURNOUT POLICY

There is a no burnout policy anywhere within the circuit confines. Penalties, fines and banned from future events may be taken by ASBK Management or the ASBK Race Director.

TRUCK WASHING

There is no truck washing on site at Morgan Park Raceway

PROMOTIONAL SCHEDULE

Riders and teams are reminded to follow the information and directive of the Promotional Schedule. Failure to do so may result in penalties by ASBK Race Direction.

OHS

All competitors must comply with the OHS Safety and Compliance Morgan Park Raceway and any state government regulations. Including, but limited too.

- (Fire Safety) You must provide suitable fire safety equipment (including fire extinguishers and fire blankets) having regard to the nature of your business to be undertaken at the Stall and must comply with all laws, regulations and directions or policies of Circuit in relation to fire prevention and emergency evacuation procedures. All LPG bottles you bring onto the site must comply with relevant laws, standards and regulations.
- (Incident Reporting) You must immediately report all accidents, emergencies and incidents to Circuit and provide Circuit
- (Compliance with Laws) At all times while on Site you must ensure that your Personnel comply with all laws, regulations, codes and standards applicable to the Site, your business or the Event including without limitation Work Health and Safety Laws.

CLEANING AND WASTE DISPOSAL

At All times during the event, you must:

- Keep your garage and the area around it clean, tidy and free from waste
- Dispose of all waste in the bins provided
- Not dispose of any liquid waste on-site except with the prior consent and in accordance with directions of Morgan Park Raceway.
- Upon conclusion of the Event, remove all waste and return the garage and area around it to the condition as at the commencement of the Bump-In period and remedy all damage caused to the garage and the area around it (fair wear and tear excepted)
