MoMS Chapter 6

Section 6.18.8 Use of Non-OEM Parts

6.18.8.1 The following may be replaced with parts not manufactured by the manufacturer of the Machine:

Item t) The original water and/or oil radiator can be modified or replaced.

- i) Extra mounting brackets to accommodate the radiator are permitted but must mount to the frame in the same location as the OEM radiator
- ii) Additional water radiators and oil coolers can be added. Extra mounting brackets to accommodate these radiators/coolers are allowed.
- iii) The appearance from the front, the rear and the profile of the motorcycle must conform to the homologated shape after the addition of radiators/oil coolers.
- iv) All radiators/coolers must be mounted below the lower fork bridge (triple clamp).

ASBK Sporting Regulations

4.24 Technical Regulations: Superbike

Section 8. Use of Non-OEM Parts

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Rationale:

The Australian Road Race Commission, ASBK Management Team, and the Rules & Technical Committee have carefully reviewed extensive data received from various Superbike competitors and brands. This data highlighted a critical issue that engine coolant and oil temperatures have been reaching levels that adversely affect engine reliability.

To address these concerns, they have determined that allowing the use of larger radiators is necessary to prevent excessive engine wear and reduce the frequency of maintenance required. Ultimately decreasing the overall costs for competitors in the Superbike class.

The decision to approve larger radiators is based on the data provided by those actively competing in the series and the need to ensure engine longevity and reliability across all brands of machines.
